

This novel is a "Best in Fiction Book for 2023" and a #1 New York Times Bestseller.

In the spring of 2020, Lara's daughters return to the family's orchard in Northern Michigan. The girls beg their mother to tell them the story of Peter Duke, a famous actor with whom she shared both a stage and a romance years before at a theater company called Tom Lake. Tom Lake is a meditation on youthful love, married love, and the lives parents have led before their children were born.
