### A Review of October MEP Events


Two wine seminars were held and enjoyed by all who participated. Our thanks to Nikia Lemaire,

Members enjoyed a wonderful trip to Charlottesville on October 30. The Council had exclusive use of the Kluge-Ruhe Museum in order to view their collection of Contemporary Aboriginal Art. Our group was intrigued enough to be interested in coming back to Charlottesville to visit The Fralin's upcoming exhibit (2/3/24 - :7/14/24) Madayin Eight Decades of Aboriginal Australian Bark Painting from Yirrkala and an exhibition of slit drums of New Guinea. The exhibition will feature more than 50 masterpieces of ochre painting on eucalyptus bark, many of which have never been on view outside of Australia. It is one of the most significant touring exhibitions of Aboriginal Australian art ever staged.

After a delicious lunch at the Quirk Hotel, we visited the workshop of Gabriel Ofiesh Jewelry. Gabriel Ofiesh's work is beautiful, and he was very generous explaining and demonstrating his process to create the jewelry.






#### Complimentary General Admission Tickets to Craft + Design, November 18-19 are available for Council Members

## **Upcoming MEP Events**


