Entitled **Curators' Picks: The Jewels of the Crown of the VMFA**, the tours will showcase works of art throughout the museum which have been specifically chosen by our outstanding curators. In conjunction with Council Leadership, curators were asked to select pieces from the collections they oversee that they particularly admire and prize, that is, *the jewels of the VMFA collections*. 



#### Volunteers are needed for the following shifts:


- Full day from 10:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m.
